The fast pace of technological evolution leads to challenges in finding workers with the right skills, as these are constantly changing.


ASSETs+ aims to design and develop new courses on emerging technologies for Human Resources in Defence, to ensure European sovereignty and autonomy.






Complementary education & training programmes are addressing the following main technologies:


